Enhancing Patient Outcomes

- All faculty is required to disclose to the ACP any relevant financial relationship(s) that they have with any commercial interest or the manufacturer(s) of any commercial product/service. A commercial interest is defined as “any entity producing, marketing, re-selling, or distributing health care goods or services consumed by, or used on, patients.” Please contact [Pam Beaton](#) with any questions about what constitutes a non-commercial interest.
- Disclosure information will be reviewed by the CME committee and that identified conflicts of interest be resolved prior to my presentation(s). This could include the review and modifications of presentation(s) and/or content prior to the activity.
- All faculty must advise the audience if their presentation includes any discussion of a product or device not labeled by the FDA for the use under discussion or that is still investigational.
- All faculty must design a presentation(s) that is free from commercial bias for or against any product, will promote quality or improvements in healthcare, and will not promote a specific proprietary business interest or a commercial interest.
- All faculty must give a balanced view of therapeutic options by using generic names to the extent possible when discussing specific health care products or services. If discussing trade names, faculty will use trade names from all companies when available, and not just trade names from any single company.
- All presentations must NOT include any logos, advertising, trade names, or product-group messages (including those of personal businesses or publications).
- All presentations must not include pictures of products or devices, or if they are included, any trade names will be blocked out.
- All presentations must be supported by clinical recommendations with the “best available evidence” from current medical literature. All scientific research referred to, reported or used in support or justification of patient care recommendations will conform to the generally accepted standards of experimental design, data collection and analysis.
- A formal observer may be attending the session to ensure that presentations are educational, and not promotional, in nature.
- All faculty must not accept any honoraria, additional payments, credits, or reimbursements for this CME activity beyond what has been agreed upon directly with the ACP.
- All presentations will be reviewed prior to the activity, and all faculty will need to provide slides no later than THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 22, 2011.
- If faculty does not comply with all of the above, they might be barred from participating as faculty at future ACP meetings.
